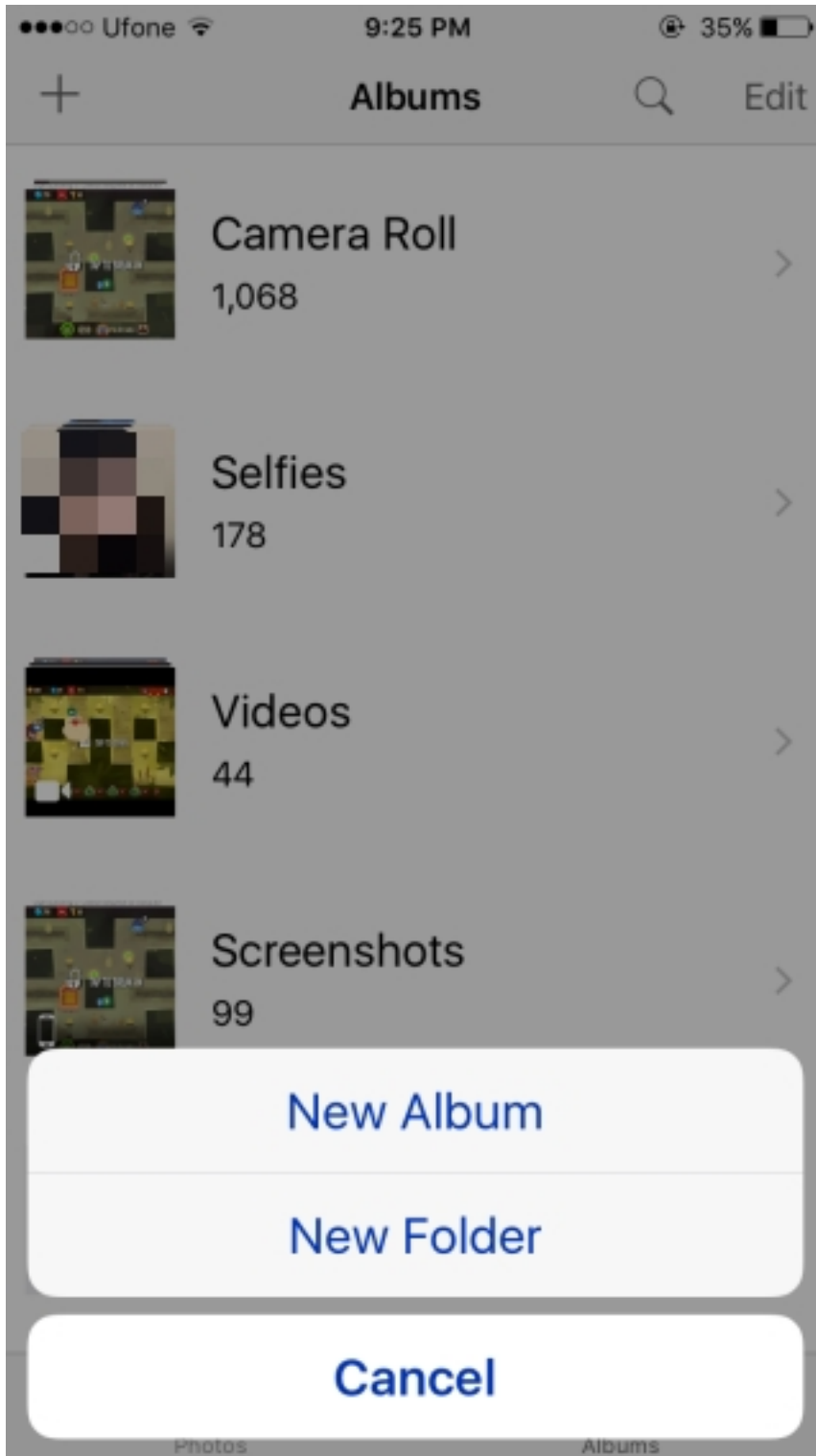
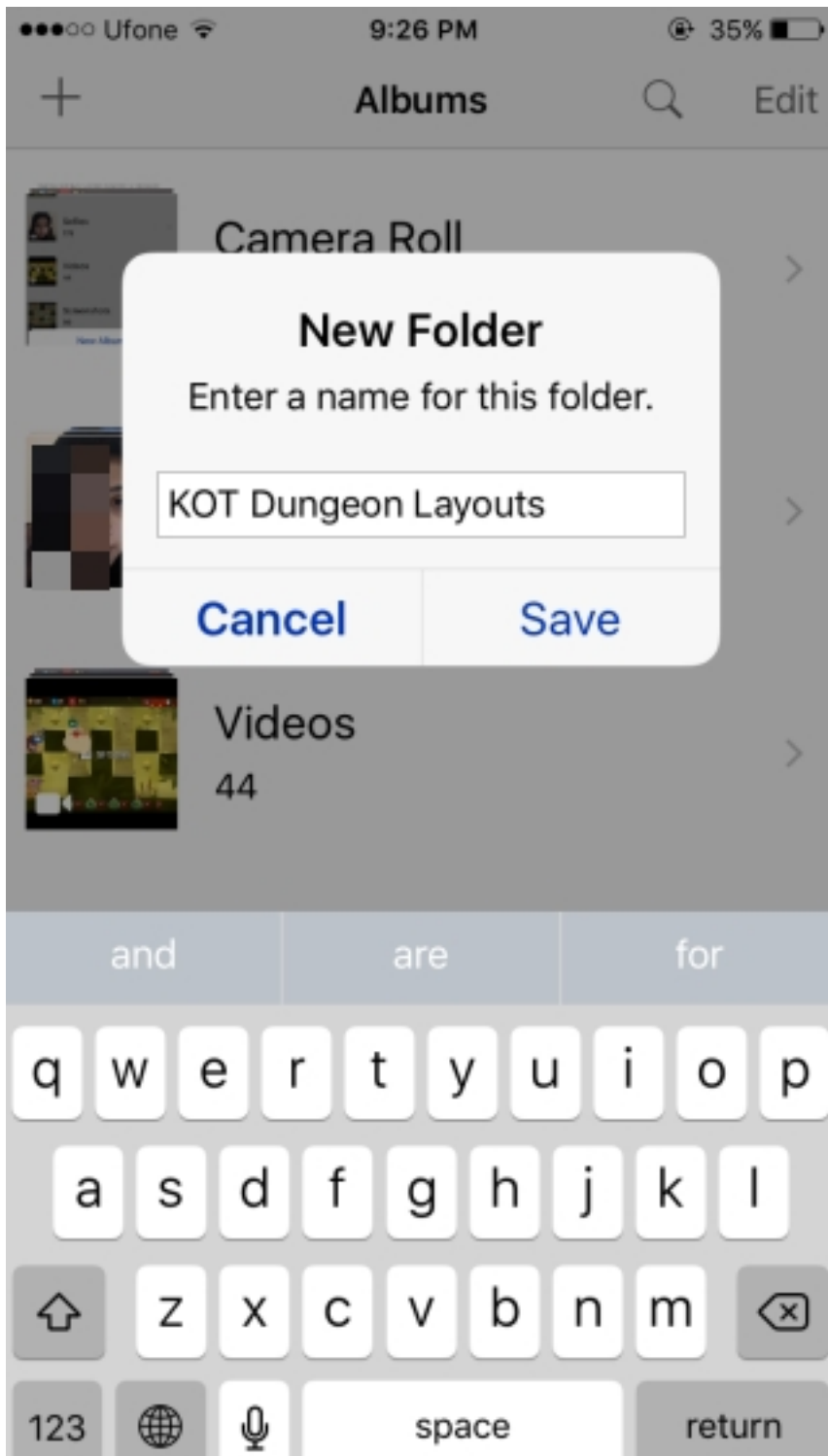


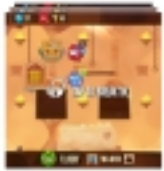
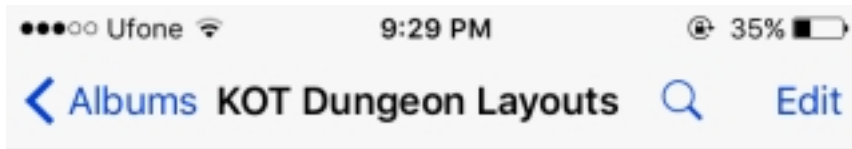
We've long been able to create albums in the Photos app in iOS. With iOS 9, the albums automatically generated now include one for screenshots and one for selfies. The screenshot album is accurate however the selfies album treats any and all photos taken with the front facing camera as selfies so it does get them wrong some time. What not many people might know (and I include myself among those people) is that as of iOS 8.3, you can also create folders inside the Photos app in addition to creating albums in it. Here's how.

Open the Photos app and tap & hold the plus button at the top left and from the menu tap 'New Folder'. Name the folder and tap 'Save'. The folder will be added at the very end of the list of albums. So long as it's empty, it will look just like an album.

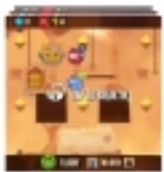




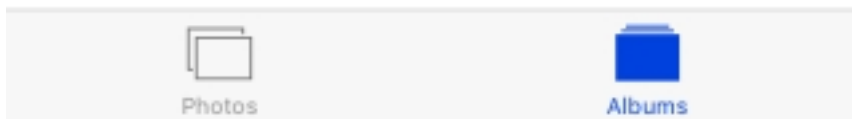
When you're ready to save the folder, tap the 'Save' button. The folder will be created and added to the 'Albums' list. You can then tap the folder to view its contents.

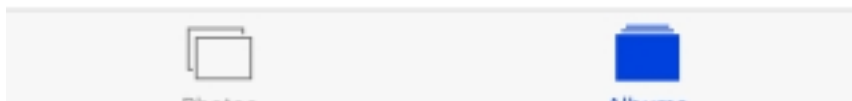
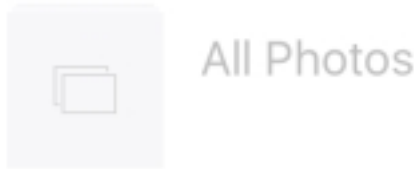
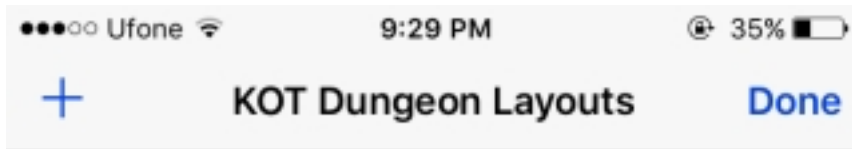
